IDENTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

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2. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COOPERATION PROGRAMME (Article 50(2) of Regulation (EU) No 1303/2013 and Article 14(3)(a) of Regulation (EU) No 1299/2013)

Key information on the implementation of the cooperation programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data.

During year 2021 all activities concerning implementation of the projects financed from the reserve list under the 2nd Call for Proposals (CfP) (launched in 2018) of the Interreg – IPA II CBC Programme 2014-2020 CCI 2014TC16I5CB006 (hereinafter referred as Programme) were ongoing. Therefore, the joint efforts of Managing Authority (MA), National Authority (NA) and Joint Secretariat (JS) were focus on monitoring of projects implementation together with programming of new period 2021-2027.

Projects implementation in 2021

By 31 December 2020, 7 (seven) "soft measures" projects successfully completed their implementation under the 2nd Call for proposals and 10 investment projects at the total amount of EUR 4 360 862,08 remained under implementation in 2021.

In the period January-March 2021 additional 5 (five) subsidy contracts with projects from the reserve list under PA 1 "Environment" of the Second Call for Proposals were signed at the total amount of 1 801 673,97 EUR-1 "soft" measures project and 4 investment projects.

By 31 December 2021, 79 contracts under 2 Calls were signed under the Programme, of which 73 subsidy contracts (26 contracts under PA 1 "Environment", 27 contracts under PA 2 "Tourism" and 20 contracts under PA 3 "Competitiveness") at the total amount of EUR 18 140 921 and 6 contracts under PA 4 Technical Assistance at the total amount of EUR 1 802 417, which represents 102.47% of the total Programme budget including over-contracting; As result by 31 December 2021 64 subsidy contracts had been successfully completed and 9 projects remained under implementation in 2022.

During 2021the following 9 projects completed their implementation:

PA 1 "Environment" – 4 projects at the total amount of 1 778 539 EUR

PA 2 "Tourism" - 5 projects at the total amount of 2 439 107 EUR

While in 2020 the projects which had difficulties in implementation of the activities are mainly soft ones, which require gathering of large group of people or include vulnerable target groups as children, in 2021 the crisis affected and investment projects. The response mechanism by the MA, NA and JS includes variety of measures: suspension/extension of subsidy contracts, small content change and reorganization to online events, as well as close monitoring of project implementation, online on-the-spot checks.

Two additional agreements (addenda) to the subsidy contracts were concluded and 1 budget change of a project was approved in 2021. Three reports for the assessment of the risk at the project level had been prepared and approved by Head of MA as the respective recommendations/corrective measures to overcome the risk had been taken into account by the beneficiaries.

In 2021 Joint Monitoring Committee (JMC) continued to perform its functions for monitoring of the implementation and evaluation of the Programme. In addition 3 written procedures were carried out by JMC as well as 1 on-line meeting in November 2021 related to the approval of the amendment in the Eligibility of expenditures under PA4 Technical Assistance.

During 2021 the official website of the Programme www.ipa-cbc-007.eu (accessible to people with disabilities as well) was one of the main publicity tools to promote the Programme and to disseminate the relevant information in a user-friendly interface, which allows the necessary information to be found more easily. During the 2021 the Programme website was visited 43 174 times by 23 874 visitors. Programme related information has been published on the Facebook and Twitter Programme profiles. Programming 2021-2027

In 2021, MA in coordination with NA continued the process of programming of the future Interreg-IPA Programme for programming period 2021-2027. The following activities related were conducted:

- February 2021- revised version of the Programme's Intervention logic, updated according to the latest amendments in the draft Regulations, had been approved on online meeting of Joint Working Group (JWG) on 11 February 2021.
- March 2021- a Task Force on the elaboration of the Integrated Territorial Strategy 2021-2027 was established representing all relevant regional and local authorities, as well as other local stakeholders related to the preparation and implementation of the strategy (pursuant to Art. 29 of the CPR). The main responsibility of the TF is to collaborate with the Consultant during the elaboration of the Territorial strategy under PO 5 "Europe closer to citizens" and to feed in results of dialogues with relevant stakeholders, databases, expert positions etc. The first draft of the Strategy has been published for consultations on April 14, 2021 as received commends from local stakeholders had been incorporated in the revised version of the document.
- October 2021 written procedure of the JWG for approval of the first draft of the IPA III Bulgaria North Macedonia programme 2021-2027 (sections related to the program strategy - territorial needs and potentials, objectives and priorities of the programs, indicative activities, communication measures);
- November- December 2021 launched campaign for collecting project ideas in the context of the Integrated Territorial Strategy of IPA programme Bulgaria North Macedonia 2021-2027- several public consultations were held on the territory of both partnering countries;
- As a part of preparation of the Environmental Assessment Report (EAR) of the Programme and of the Integrated territorial strategy for the CBC region two rounds of public consultations were held in both partnering countries. The first consultations were organized in July 2021 (in Bulgaria) and August (in North Macedonia) 2021 on Scoping Report for determination of the scope and content of the EAR. The second round consultations were conducted in the period November December 2021 (in Bulgaria) on the Environmental assessment report. The received comments from all institutions and stakeholders will be reflected in the respective documents.
- December 2021- Draft Decision of Council of Ministers (DCM) prepared for approval of the composition of the Bulgarian part of the Joint Expert Committee under Art. 4 of the Agreement of 14.06.1999 between the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria and the Government of the Republic of North Macedonia, and a draft DMC for determining the beneficiary / contracting authority in connection with the construction of a new border checkpoint (BCCP) between Strumyani, Bulgaria and Berovo, North Macedonia;

4. SYNTHESIS OF THE EVALUATIONS

According to the Programme Evaluation Plan (approved on 14.04.2016 by the JMC) the Implementation/mid-term evaluation of the Programme had been launched in June 2018. Tender procedure for Implementation evaluation under Interreg - IPA CBC Programmes, managed by the Republic of Bulgaria, had been completed and service contract with external consultant was signed on 23th of August 2018 with 7 months duration.

The contract ended in March 2019 and the Implementation evaluation report of the Programme 2014-2020 has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Art. 56 (3) of the Regulation (EU) № 1303/2013.

Detailed information about mid-term evaluation of the Programme has been presented in the Annual Implementation report for 2019. The recommendations from the evaluation were accepted and taken into account in the process of preparation of the Interreg-VI-A IPA Bulgaria – North Macedonia Programme for the programming period 2021-2027.

5. ISSUES AFFECTING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE PROGRAMME AND MEASURES TAKEN

(a) Issues which affect the performance of the programme and the measures taken

In 2021 the programme implementation was still marked by the COVID-19 world pandemic. The published by MA guidelines in relation to the emergency measures related to COVID-19 were updated in April 2021. Due to the pandemic situation and the local measures of the health authorities a revised version of Instructions and the amended FLC guidelines was published on the web-site of the programme including the following topics, essential for the applicant and the project partners:

- ✓ Contracting conduction of the pre-contracting procedures in written form or via videoconference. Carrying out of the on-the-spot checks in accordance with the specificities and requirements of the emergency measures in the partner countries;
- ✓ Project implementation

Analysis of the project activities – the partners were advised to analyze the planned activities taking into consideration any impediments as a consequence of the measures related to COVID-19, as well as the possibilities to implement soft measure activities by alternative means, including digital ones or to postpone at a later date;

Suspension – the MA allowed a temporary suspension of the deadline for implementation of the subsidy contracts. The suspended contracts should provide to the JS the above-mentioned analysis of the planned activities. Within this the partners should be presented notification for small content change with updated duration and action plan or the relevant request for contract modification to the MA;

Contracts for the implementation of the project activities - the beneficiaries, which are contracting authorities under PRAG rules may allow changes in the terms of the contract only if the non-fulfillment is due to "force majeure" / "exceptional circumstances";

- ✓ Reporting, documentary and on-the-spot check the reporting to the JS and the submission of requests for FLC were maintained in the established format by electronic exchange of documents through the Beneficiary Portal. Documentary checks carried out by the JS and the Controllers of the FLC continued on a regular basis. The on-the-spot checks carried out by the JS and the Controllers of the FLC tailored to the specificities and requirements of the emergency measures in the partner countries. At the discretion of the JS/FLC controllers and after approval by the Managing Authority, "virtual on-the-spot checks" may be carried out for the preparation of which the beneficiaries will be duly instructed;
- ✓ Requests for payments, decisions for imposing financial corrections, recoveries to MA the MA continued to process requests for advance, interim and final payments, the irregularities signals with respect to the partners on the territory of the Republic of Bulgaria, issuing decisions for imposing financial corrections and preparing letters for financial corrections recovery amounts and unsolicited advance payments.

Furthermore, in order to minimize the negative impact on the work plan implementation the JS conducted regular monitoring for projects and ensured the beneficiaries to carry out remaining project activities/events by alternative means, including digital ones.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic situation and the local measures of the health authorities a revised version of Instructions and the amended FLC guidelines was published on the web-site of the programme. Preserving the health of all involved and help in the fight against the pandemic, the MA is temporarily introducing an alternative option for verification - Virtual (online) verification replaced on-the-spot visits and verification for "soft" projects.
